WHO ARE WE? WHAT DO WE DO?

Compagnons Bâtisseurs is a national movement that began at the end of World War 2.

Compagnons Bâtisseurs Nouvelle Aquitaine was created in January 2005 and is a "public interest organization".

Compagnons Bâtisseurs Nouvelle Aquitaine operates in the construction and housing sector, using its technical expertise to serve two social objectives:

the right to a place to live, and the right to social and professional activity for everyone.

Compagnons Bâtisseurs Nouvelle Aquitaine carries out two main types of activities:

 Social integration through housing Self-Renovation and Supported Self-Construction, together with neighbourhood workshops, libraries of tools and voluntary work sites.

 Labour market integration by developing job training (Chantiers Formation Qualification) and labour market integration initiatives (Chantiers d'Insertion, chantiers « travail d'intérêt général »).

These activities can be carried out separately or grouped within the framework of a 'Integrated Area-based Social Intervention'.

The « SOLI'BâT » platform

This project brings together more than fifty partners including: political institutions; construction companies; and social and humanitarian actors.

The « SOLI'BâT » platform uses principles of the circular economy, to enhance social economy, housing for disadvantaged people and job creation.

It has three objectives:

① To organise and collect construction materials and equipment.

Unused building materials (end of line, deadstock, alternative range, etc.) is collected from companies and individuals

Using materials and equipment that were destined to become waste. We are committed to sustainable development.

② Store, inventory, inform and redistribute

Individual beneficiaries: struggling homeowners and tenants **Institutional beneficiaries**: organisations of social economy and labour insertion, managers of social housing, local administrations

In the context of housing rehabilitation projects: supported self-renovation and self-construction, housing improvement schemes, training workshop or integration projects, fight against substandard housing and against energy deprivation, "reste capable" programme,...

 Fighting against poor housing by reducing building costs with free / low cost materials.
We are committed to circular economy with a social aim.

③Develop long-term local employment and labour-market integration


Long-term employment by creating Platform Manager positions Labour-market integration by combining new jobs with training
