
RECRUITING NEW FISHERS IN LAPLAND



- <u>BIG PROBLEM</u>: the average age of fishermen was 56 in 2015
- Lokka Fishermen's Cooperative contacted municipality of Sodankylä:
- "We must do something, otherwise this business dies in ten years!"
- Municipality assembled the first meeting in the end of 2015:
- ➤ Municipality, fishermen, FLAG, regional employment agency, municipal social security. Also experiences from previous masterapprentice projects were explored
- During 2016, a recruitment project was prepared in close collaboration between municipality, fishermen's cooperative and FLAG.

"FISHER'S PATH"

As the initiative to the project came from the fishermen, they were fully committed to all measures taken in project:

Publicity: social media, radio + TV, articles in newspapers, advertisements in fisher's magazines, road show in educational institutes

Training in practise: candidates were given individual training in fishing, fish handling and processing, marketing, safety etc. The senior fishers provided training based on their own specific skills.

Burocracy: FLAG helped the new entrepreneurs with all the paper work

RESULTS

Ca. 30 candidates, aged
 21-64, were interested
 enough to visit the fisher
 village of Lokka

• 14 have started a career as a commercial fisher, 10 full-time, 4 part-time (2 females, 12 males)

 Half of the full-timers were local, half came from Southern Finland



THE KEY ELEMENTS OF SUCCESS

 The project was honestly CLLD: the initiative came from the fishers, so they were fully committed

 Close cooperation between fishers, municipality, employment authorities and the FLAG

 Holistic approach: the project needs to consider the new fishers' living needs and the community must be ready to help the newcomers to integrate into the community.



Although the project has ended, Lokka Fishermen's Cooperative still continues to welcome and train newcomers in the same way.

A new recruitment project started in 2021 in the southern part of the FLAG
